1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Thanksgiving Food Drive

We distribute complete Thanksgiving dinners to Families in need as well as Marine families on local Food Bank Families.

Santa's Visit

The club reaches out to 6 local schools. The event provides toys between 5—600 kids. Days Event: gates open at 9:00 AM, kids are treated to cookie decorations, holiday craft, face painting etc. from 9 -1:00. Mr. and Mrs. Santa arrives via SJ Firetruck and present each child with an age appropriate gift.

We collect 500-600 Toys for distribution to need children [this maybe the only gift that they receive]

Have a craft area with many holiday activities for the children to do.

Decorate the Multipurpose Room at Marco Forster Middle School for Mr. and Mrs. Santa on stage, and room with paper and garland.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

Thanksgiving Food Drive: 80-100 Needy families and Marine Families

Santa Visit- 500-600 Kids

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Thanksgiving Food Drive: The families would not have a traditional Thanksgiving dinner with their families. It is very much appreciated by all who receive the 'complete' dinner.

Santa's Visit: The children come from low economic status and if we did not do this many children would not receive a toy for Christmas or enjoy a visit with Santa or have an opportunity to have a great Holiday Party. It is a wonderful community outreach.

6. Other organization Help: INTERACT KIDS from Capo Valley HS and SJH HS work at supermarkets collecting food for the Food Drive and provide activities for children at Santa's Visit as well as assist with gift distribution. Marco Forster Middle School P.A.L. kids wrap gifts and assist with gift distribution for Santa's Visit and San Juan Elementary School kids decorate the boxes for the Thanksgiving meals to be delivered. These kids benefit by getting the opportunity to help their fellow students and support their community. They are wonderful and provide us support on ALL aspect of these events. It runs smoothly because of their support.


