1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries? On Dec. 17, 2017, our club provided a holiday ham and two \$50 gift certificates to 200 families of the most junior enlisted Marines and Navy personnel at Camp Pendleton, CA. We provide them with these as they came through the Armed Services YMCA to pick up their Toys for Tots for Christmas.				
<ol> <li>How many Rotarians participated in the project?</li> <li>All 18 members raised the necessary \$30,000 for this project. 5 Rotarians assisted with the distribution on Dec. 17.</li> </ol>				
3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. All club members donated or raised the \$30,000 for the project including the matching grant funds used to purcvhase the 200 hams from Costco. Additionally, club members did the purchasing, transporting, and getting the gift cards we gave to each family.				
4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? The 200 families representing about 800 people who received the hams/gift cartds received the greatest benefit to help complete their holiday. However, each Rotarian participating toward this project for our 9th consecutive year expressed deep emotion and commitment to continuing this project as we personally see the impact this small gift impacted these families.				
5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? Families continue to express deep appreciation for making their holiday so meaningful and for their holiday dinner that many did have the means to provide for themselves.				
6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? The Armed Services YMCA at Camp Pendleton identified the families needing the most assistance and purchased the commissary gift carts with funds we provided to them. We also had funds to donate \$5000 to their after school mentoring programs.
