2017/2018 District 5320 Matching Grant Program <u>Community Outreach Initiative</u>

OVERVIEW

The Service Area of the Rotary Club of Los Alamitos/Seal Beach has a total population of less than 50,000 and is home to over 360 nonprofit organizations, the highest per capita ratio in Orange County

The Rotary Club of Los Alamitos/Seal Beach has a long and proud history of working with and through our nonprofit agencies and this *Community Outreach Initiative* expands on that tradition.

We have selected three nonprofit organizations that will benefit from this initiative. The narrative that follows provides a brief description of the proposed projects.

Summer Harvest

This organization exists for the sole purpose of providing food and other resources to children and families enrolled in the Free/Reduced Lunch Program when school is <u>not</u> in session. Children on the Free/Reduced Lunch Program are from the poorest of the community and must show proof of need. www.summerharvest.us

Grant Funding: Up to \$3,000 for the purchase up to 600 school backpacks which will contain generic school supplies provided by Summer Harvest.

Club Participation: Club members will assist with the filling each backpack with the school supplies and distributing them to the students. Each backpack will contain a card indicating that it was made possible, in part, by a grant from the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International.

Impact: 600 children will begin the school year with a backpack and school supplies thus allowing the family to provide other resources to their children.

Precious Life Shelter

This organization serves pregnant women who are homeless. Services offered are wide-ranging and include housing, healthcare, education, accountability and transitional services. Precious Life Shelter is in the final stages of building permanent housing for alumni of the program. <u>www.preciouslifeshelter.org</u>

Grant Funding: Up to \$650 for the purchase of two (2) 30-gallon trees for planting along the parkway of the new Permanent Housing facility.

Club Participation: Club membership will assist in the actual planting of the trees and a plaque will be installed indicating that the trees were made possible, in part, by a grant from the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International.

Impact: Purchase of the trees will free-up resources that can be used for direct services to the women and children served by Precious Life Shelter.

The Youth Center

The Youth Center was established in 1952 and provides a wide array of after school and summer activities for young people; it is totally dependent on resources provided by the community.

Grant Funding: Up to \$550 for the purchase of a high-quality portable basketball system that will expand activities available to the children served by the Youth Center.

Club Participation: Club membership will assist with the assembly and positioning of the basketball system and participate in a ribbon cutting ceremony. The basketball system will contain an appropriate acknowledgement that it was made possible, in part, by a grant from the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International.

Impact: The 150 children who attend afterschool activities at the Youth Center will have access to the new equipment.
