PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

1. What is the purpose of this project?

The purpose of this project is to provide musical instruments for the nonprofit organization Capistrano Community Mariachi Program (CCMP) that offers mariachi music education to low income children and the youth in the community of San Juan Capistrano with minimal or no cost to them. Mariachi For All – Capistrano Community Mariachi Program (CCMP) serves approximately 125 students per year. The project includes instruction, technology, instruments, mariachi suits, and out-of-state mariachi conferences.

2. How will it meet the needs of the community?

CCMP mission is to "enhance quality of life by engaging our diverse community in high-quality music education". It offers our youth with an alternative to gangs, drugs, and other destructive activities, by promoting healthy families through the involvement in learning mariachi music individually and as a family. This program strives to help our community to keep our youth safe and encourages them to explore and expand the awareness of cultural arts while becoming confident and productive citizens. CCMP was founded in September 2008 and is a non-profit organization mariachi music school.

There are three basic goals that meet the needs of the community:

- 1) To serve and add value to the South Orange County communities by teaching the CCMP students, mostly who are Latino school-aged children that are in an at-risk in the community.
- 2) To engage in the educational and musical development of CCMP students and instructors by providing an intellectually challenging and innovative approach for its mariachi program.

3) To develop a sustainable curriculum that allows current instructors to learn new music techniques to train current and new students. The Enrichment Project is a 5-year long project.

Due to our increase of enrollment of low-income students who can't afford purchasing their own instruments (especially the most expensive ones, such as the guitarron and trumpet) CCMP has the urgent need to provide students with access to such music instruments. This grant will have a significant impact on our continued ability to provide instruction to low income children at no cost to them satisfying a need in the community.

Re: Mission Statement and Services

The purpose of this letter is to explain the mission and services provided by the Mariachi For All – Capistrano Community Mariachi Program (CCMP). Established in 2008 by the Ceja Family, CCMP from Mariachi For all is a 501(c)(3) non—profit mariachi music organization (#30-0601599) located in San Juan Capistrano. CCMP seeks funding program support from the Monarch Beach Rotary Club in order to continue providing the children and youth of South Orange County with a high quality music education as an alternative to drugs, gangs and other destructive activities.

The CCMP targets at-risk Latino youth in South Orange County. More than 50% of this population lives below the federal poverty line, causing youth to be susceptible to gang recruitment (Census 2000). Gang members under the age of fourteen have increased in San Juan Capistrano by more than 400% since 2003 with approximately 250 known gang members in the local area. (Orange County Grand Jury Report 2009).

Since initiation, the CCMP has served over 528 students, from underprivileged areas of South Orange County, with services including, but not limited to, teaching basic music fundamentals, mariachi fundamentals, and performance. CCMP strives to keep youth off the streets by encouraging healthy families and lifestyles. Students build self-esteem by being introduced to and learning to play musical instruments which are inherent to mariachi.

CCMP provides students with a focus on learning music and giving back to the community. Our performing mariachi groups are committed to giving back to the community by performing at local schools, libraries, senior centers, government programs, and at other non-profit organizatios' events. Both, Mariachi Capistrano and Mariachi Corazón de Capistrano, have performed at



community/neighborhood events held by the OC District Attorney's Gang Intervention Reduction and Intervention Partnership (GRIP) to promote healthy afterschool activities and help raise the awareness of gang prevention. Examples of other CCMP performances include the San Juan Capistrano Swallows Day Parade; San Juan Capistrano Public Library –Día de los Muertos; San Juan Capistrano Chamber of Commerce; Relay for Live (San Juan Capistrano and Dana Point); Pediatric Cancer Research Foundation Marathon; Orange County Fair; Orange County Children's Therapeutic Arts Center; The Mission San Juan; and the Annual San Juan Capistrano Battle of The Mariachi.

Besides giving back to the community, CCMP's performing groups strive for excellence in musicianship. On April, 2010, Mariachi Capistrano, CCMP's first performing group, helped break a Guinness World Record at La Frontera Mariachi Conference in Tucson, Arizona and competed in the San Juan Capistrano 6th Annual Mariachi Competition and the 4th Annual Anaheim Mariachi Festival. Currently, Mariachi Capistrano continues to perform all over Orange County and Los Angeles County and is the hosting band for the Annual Battle of the Mariachi at the Mission San Juan. Mariachi Corazón de Capistrano, CCMP's second mariachi band comprised of mostly pre-teen students, has also taken the lead in performances. They recently accomplished their second annual performance at the San Ana College, Don Mariachi Concert and performed at The Battle of the Dance Dinner Theatre in Anaheim.

By developing performing bands, CCMP strives to provide children and youth with the opportunity to acquire great self-esteem and remarkable social and leadership skills, leading them to become principle-centered and productive citizens for the South Orange County communities.

But we cannot accomplish our goals without the help of our communities. It is why CCMP seeks financial support from the Monarch Beach Rotary Club and we appreciate and thank you all for your sincerely interested in our cause. 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
