READING BY 9 2018-2019

GOALS:

Raise \$50,000+ through Rotarian donations and matching funds (in 2017 raised an all-time record of \$65,000) at annual fundraising meeting on October 17th. \$56,000+ raised and have \$6,000 from reserve to fund up to \$62,000 Celebrate and promote the 20th Year of Reading by 9 at Long Beach Rotary Entire Rotary program devoted to Reading by 9 and literacy programs Have an active Literacy Committee overseeing our program Literacy Committee has met 3 times and has approved all recommendations

PROPOSED DONATIONS:

\$2,000 of Scholastic Books to 5+ LBUSD elementary schools (schools selected from LBUSD priority list)-last year 7 schools received books Fund a minimum of 7 schools to match last year for a total of \$14,000

\$7,500+/- of Scholastic books for CDC pre-school program/students (book given to each child in program)

Fund \$7,500 after reviewing the number of pre-school children in the program

Continue "Best of" book program with LBUSD elementary schools Continue with 3 schools and \$6,000 of funding

\$7,500 or more of grants to support LB area non-profit literacy programs Increase to \$9,000 (with discretion to increase to \$10,000)

\$7,500 or more for Teacher Literacy grants

Increase to \$9,000—grant applications submitted to LBUSD

Continue EBOOK Project with LBUSD and Kindergarten Festival sponsorship. Fund same as last year (\$8,000 ebooks and \$1,500 K-festival)

\$1,500 or more of Scholastic Books for AOC-7 Community Literacy Fair Increase funding to \$2,000

Other programs and projects with input from the LBUSD, Literacy Committee and approval by the Long Beach Rotary Charitable Foundation Board. \$5,000 remains available for new program(s) or increasing above funding

ADDITIONAL READING BY 9 COMMENTS

- The Rotary literacy program in October created significant press coverage and publicity.
- By the conclusion of this year (our 20th) we will have raised in excess of \$675,000 and donated more than 250,000 books and ebooks.
- The Literacy Committee has formed two sub-committees to review and select Teacher Literacy and Non-Profit grant recipients.
- On February 21st Rotarians will make our annual visit to a CDC site to deliver books and read to the pre-school kids. This year we will provide a book to over 2,000 kids at 27 different CDC sites throughout Long Beach.
- The ebooks are going to schools which are modernizing and will be without the use of their libraries during the schools year. This has been specifically requested by the LBUSD to assist these schools during such transitional period.
- Two of the four Kindergarten Festivals will be conducted at schools where Rotarians are reading through our Rotary Reads program.
- Likewise the AOC-7 Community Literacy Fair specifically includes elementary schools where Rotarians are reading to kids.
- Through our programs this year we are providing books and ebooks to 14 different elementary schools throughout Long Beach. The specific elementary schools are recommended to us by the LBUSD based on their assessment of where there is the greatest need.
- This fall the new Educare pre-school in North Long Beach had its grand opening featuring a library funded by Reading by 9.
- This summer the New Main Library is scheduled to open. We are working with the City of Long Beach Library staff and the Library Foundation to explore ways to provide books and do other things to enhance the Rotary Early Childhood and Storytime Area in the New Main Library.
- We welcome and encourage LBRCF Board Members to attend the CDC site visit, visit a Kindergarten Festival, the AOC-7 Community Literacy Fair or any of the non-profits or classrooms where Reading by 9 has provided grants.
