1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Purchased, delivered and served hot dinners to clients of Home Aid, City of Orange, California. The beneficiaries of these dinners are clients of Home Aid and were previously homeless. Dinners were purchased from mom-pop restaurants which also helped these struggling restaurants.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

Due to COVID-in 2020 Rotarians were only able to purchase and deliver, but unable to serve the dinners as planned for the dinners. As Orange County loosen restrictions, are only now able to purchase, deliver and serve the dinners. 12 Rotarians

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Identified restaurants, selected and ordered nutritious and balanced meals, picked up meals from restaurant, delivered to HomeAid Shelter, and depending on safety served dinners to the clients of HomeAid.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

For each dinner service there was approximately 60 clients fed.
Completed: 3 nights of dinners x 60 = 180 non-Rotarians benefited.
Last dinner scheduled for May 26, 2021, yet to be executed 1 night of dinners X 60 = 60
Total of 240 non-Rotarians benefiting

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

End homelessness

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

HomeAid Orange County is the founding chapter of a national non-profit organization with a mission of building new lives for families and individuals experiencing homelessness through housing and community outreach. HomeAid fulfills its mission through Development, Service and Advocacy. Founded in 1989 by the Orange County Chapter of the Building Industry Association of Southern California, HomeAid acts as the housing developer and liaison between service providers, community volunteers, builders, and specialty contractors.

HomeAid Orange County is the *only* community-based organization that has successfully developed 59 building and renovating housing projects which have added 1,451 shelter beds across the entire homeless Continuum of Care spectrum. By doing this, HomeAid has provided facilities that range from emergency housing, to interim housing, to permanent supportive housing. Through over twenty local service providers, HomeAid's housing developments have transformed the lives of over 55,000 people experiencing homelessness.

In 2017 HomeAid selected Mercy House to manage and operate the HomeAid Shelter in Orange, CA. (receipts reflect Mercy House as the beneficiary of the dinner)
