1.Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries? We set up a grant program to benefit students of local schools that serve students from Anaheim Hills. Anaheim Hills Rotary Club (AHRC) notifies local schools so teachers from the local schools can request grants that will benefit the students and the schools. Once we received the requests, a committee of AHRC members reviewed the requests and then purchase items. This project started in November, 2021 and was completed in May, 2022. Additionally AHRC will be donating at least \$3,000 to the <i>Every 15 Minutes</i> program coming May 27, 2022 at Canyon High School		
2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? Eight members worked on the Teacher educational grants. Additional members will volunteer to assist with the Canyon High School <i>Every 15 Minutes</i> program on May 27, 2022.		
3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. The STEP program administered by Dene Olsen, Chair of Vocational Service. Dene Olsen and his wife, Vivien Olsen, ran the project with the assistance of a committee of six other members. Emails were created and sent to schools that serve students of Anaheim Hills. The teachers were encouraged to apply for grants, up to \$500. The members who helped evaluate the grant requests and the Olsen's were responsible for handling a certain number of the approved grants. They purchased the materials and supplies and arranged for delivery of them to fulfill the approved grants. An additional related project is the <i>Every 15 Minutes</i> program at Canyon High School, where we'll donate \$3,000 and our members will donate time to assist with tasks on the day of the event.		
4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? (Others than incidentally, no Rotarians benefited from this project). Hundreds of students and teachers benefited from this program because various materials and supplies went to classrooms and libraries where many students benefited. Most of the funded projects will continue to support additional students for many years to come.
