1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
  - a) Arbor Day Tree Giveaway – Rotarians contact San Diego Growers nursery in January to arrange for the purchase of the seedlings. Trees are distributed during the Month of March, near Arbor Day.
  - b) Sweetheart Luncheon and Memorial Day Luncheons – The Sweetheart and Memorial Day Luncheons allows seniors to enjoy a festive free lunch, live entertainment and interact with Rotarians at the Tustin Senior Center.
  - c) High School Students of the Quarter – Rotarians talk with counselors at each of the continuation high schools and choose a student that is attending the high school. Awards are presented at a regular meeting of the Tustin-Santa Ana Rotary Club after the end of the quarter.
2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?
  - a) Approximately 75% of members participate in meeting students at school assemblies.
  - b) Approximately 85% of the members participate by cooking and serving lunch. Many spouses also attend.
  - c) Approximately 5 Rotarians are involved throughout the process.
3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
  - a) Distributing trees to third grade students at assemblies in 18 elementary schools in the Tustin school district provides Rotarians an opportunity to discuss with the students the value of trees to our community and world.
  - b) Club members plan the meal and purchase food. Club members meet at the Senior Center to prepare, plate, and serve the luncheon to the seniors. Rotarians serve beverages, the meal, and dessert. After serving the seniors, Rotarians sit and interact with the guests. Rotarians also clean-up after the luncheon. This event is very popular with Rotarians and many of the spouses attend as well.
4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
  - a) Every third grade student in the Tustin Unified School District,
  - b) Approximately 200
  - c) Eight students
5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?
  - a) During the Arbor Day assembly Rotarians often hear from students that their family is enjoying a tree that an older sibling received through a previous Rotary Arbor Day assembly.
  - b) The Sweetheart Luncheon has been a Club event for close to 40 years and we have set up a second luncheon (Memorial Day Celebration on May 23<sup>rd</sup>)
  - c) Although many students meet requirements to attend college, they struggle to pay tuition, room and board, books and supplies and fees. This will allow students to attend college who would be unable to attend otherwise.


