1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
During the first week of March the Tustin-Santa Ana Rotary Club distributed seedlings to all third grade students in the Tustin Unified School District. Many youngsters in the Tustin schools live in urban surroundings and are rarely exposed to parks and open space. Rotarians discuss the importance of trees to our community and world and have a question and answer period with the students before handing each child a tree to plant.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

75% of club members participate.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Distribute seedlings to 3rd Grade student 18 elementary schools at assemblies. Discuss the importance of trees to our community and world with the students.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

Approximately 2,000 3rd graders receive a seedling, plant it and watch it grow. Many adults remember the trees they received as third-graders and share their stories.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

During the Arbor Day assembly Rotarians often hear from students that their family is enjoying a tree that an older sibling received through a previous Rotary Arbor Day Assembly. Tustin is known as the City of Trees and these added trees each year contribute to that title.

Press release and photos are distributed to local papers.
