Project Title: Backpacks for Youth

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
The Rotary Club of Anaheim, along with its Satellite Club of Peace and Dignity, produced 500 backpacks, loaded with school supplies for local elementary schools. Activities included shopping for supplies, on-line and in person, assembly of backpacks, writing of inspirational message cards for each backpack, and delivery of backpacks. Backpacks were assembled at the Breezeway Learning Center on Saturday August 27, 2022. They were loaded up in cars and delivered on Tuesday August 30, 2022. They were delivered to children in person at Robert M. Pyles STEM Academy and at Twila Reed Elementary School. In addition, backpacks were delivered to the Orange County Family Justice Center and the Magnolia Elementary School District for distribution to students in need. The beneficiaries of the backpacks are chosen by the institutions and are given out on a "need" basis.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?
15 Rotarians participated in the project.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
Rotarians participated in every stage of the project, shopping, on-line and in person for materials, assembling the backpacks, and in delivery to the elementary school and the Orange County Family Justice Center.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
500 backpacks were distributed. All backpacks go to non-Rotarians and/or their families.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?
Children who do not have items that other have are often stigmatized. By having a new backpacks and all the new supplies provided the children need for their school year, they can feel confident and comfortable. We believe that this will make for a better mental state for learning.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?
Magnolia Elementary School District and Orange Family Justice Center took possession of backpacks to their students / clients. Twila Reed Elementary School and Robert M. Pyles STEM Academy both accepted backpacks for students and allowed the club volunteers on campus for distribution of backpacks to students in person.


