1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Annual Clinic in Ensenada Mexico on October 22, 2022, with the Rotary Clubs of Irvine, Califia, Manteca and San Juan Capistrano.

We gave 158 exams to kids and adults at the eye clinic. 57 received glasses.

We saw 62 kids at the dental clinic. They all received dental exams and whatever else was needed ie x-rays, pulled teeth, cavities, sealing, etc. Ages were 5 yrs. to 77 years. We worked at a rural school in south Ensenada.

These are all underserved kids.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

Rotarians from Rotary Clubs of Irvine, Califia, Manteca, and San Juan Capistrano. There were over 22 Rotarians. There were 6 Rotary exchange students

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Everyone helps set up and tear down.

a.. At the Eye Clinic they helped with the testing. Some acting as Vanna White. They directed the participants to letters on the eye chart. Some worked as interpreters. Some managed the flow of the participants.

b. At the dental clinic they helped unload and set up the dental rooms. We had 3 rooms including a sterilization and x-ray room. Some acted as helpers to manage the participates flow. Some were assistants to the Doc's. Some showed the kids how to brush, floss, etc.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

Lots but at least 158.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Kids who can see do better in school. An education can lift a person out of poverty. It can shift generationally a person and their family's quality of life.

Kids who are healthy do better in school. Healthy kids mean that parents are more available to work so they can provide for their families. This helps bring them out of poverty.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

We partner with

a. Dental Care for Children, a non-profit run by Dr. Chuck Tosser. They provide all of the Dental care and dentists.

b. Manteca Optometric provides all of the eye testing equipment, eye glasses dispensed and Dr. Fred Stellhorn who provides the exams.
