1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

This hands-on project benefited the 100 students ages 3 to 5 attending Hands Together – a Center for Child located in Santa Ana, California. Rotarians researched and purchased age appropriate art supplies (crayons, markers, watercolor paints, art paper, construction paper, scissors, pencils, pencil boxes, aprons). Small backpacks were filled with these supplies at a Social & Networking event held at James Johnson's home. Those in attendance at the Social & networking event included Rotarians, family, friends, guests and those interested in Rotary. Included with the backpacks were inspirational notes written by the attendees. In addition to the backpacks, Irvine Rotarians selected age appropriate books which were donated to the school's library. The backpacks and books were then delivered to the preschool. The original plan did include a play date, which because of scheduling problems will be postponed until summer.

It was suggested by one of our members who grew up in a low income home that parents might not have financial resources to purchase simple art supplies to be used at home to inspire the creativity of their student. A small group of Rotarians met to discuss items for pre-k student backpacks and books to be donated. A list of age appropriate supplies was developed, price comparisons of various vendors, ordering, assembling of the purchased items into the backpacks for distribution.

Rotarians and prospective members had gathered at President James Johnson's home on a Saturday for a Social and Networking event, it was during this event that Rotarians, family, friends and guests filled the backpacks and wrote the inspirational notes.

A date was arranged with the director of the preschool for delivery of the donations. Books and backpacks were delivered to the preschool for distribution to the students. We had the opportunity to distribute the backpacks and interact briefly with students .

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

The 100 backpacks will be distributed to the students currently attending the preschool, these supplies will be used by the students and their siblings. The books donated to the school will be available to the teachers, the 100 current students, their families, and future students of the school.
