Project Description: To provide families in need in Larimer county with holiday baskets of food.

- 2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

Our club raised \$3,879.79 plus used the \$2,286.00 District Grant to provide holiday meal baskets to 81 families in need. Club members and their families assembled these baskets at the Food Bank of Larimer County in Loveland and distributed them the next day. Food was purchased through Safeway, the Food Bank as well as donated food items from the Food Bank. Beneficiaries were Neighbor to Neighbor, Care Housing, Crossroads Safehouse and Child Safe. These beneficiaries worked to identify the families in their communities that would benefit from the meals. Funds raised over the purchases amount were donated to the Food Bank of Larimer County.

- 3. How many Rotarians participated in this project? 35 Rotarians plus 16 family members. Additional members contributed to the fundraising.
- 4. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
 - Club members met at the Food Bank of Larimer County on a Friday afternoon to assemble the 320 bags of food for the holiday meals.
 - Club Members and family picked up the meals from the Food Bank on Saturday morning to distribute to 81 families.

- 5. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
 - 81 families were given meals with a total of approximately 200 people served.
- 6. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

This project provided great relief to those experiencing food insecurity in our community. Each family received four bags filled with food plus additional food for the winter break. The funds raised were used to match our grant, buy supplies needed to create the bags, buy additional groceries not available through the food bank and provide a welcome donation to the Food Bank of Larimer County. Food Bank donation was \$4,233.97!

7. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?

The Food Bank of Larimer County allowed our club to purchase grocery items at a discount using their buying power as well as donated items they had available to add to our baskets.
