1. A Detailed Project Description

The Kinship Living Program seeks to offer adolescents aged 14 to 17, who are placed in relative care due to safety concerns or potential abuse by their parents, opportunities to make personal choices that enhance their happiness and contribute to their self-esteem and self-acceptance.

- a. The funds will be used to support the program which aims to alleviate financial burdens for caregivers associated with purchasing school supplies, back packs, shoes, clothing and other essential items.
- b. The program is direct support for foster youth in our local community
- c. The timeline is September 1st, through November 30th 2025.
- d. Members of the VPRC are involved in the oversite of the program and selection of the qualifying youth and the items they request.
- 2. Budget Breakdown
- a. Total Project cost for the Fall Semester is \$4,500.00
- b. The amount requested from VPRC is \$3,000.00 and \$1,500.00 from District 5320

- 3. Beneficiary Impact
- a. Number of foster youths served =30
- b. The program serves a dual purpose in that it provides much needed items such as school supplies, back packs, shoes, clothing and other essential items which care takes may not have the resources to provide. Because the program provides the benefit directly to the youth, the program supports financial literacy and responsibility in managing an assigned monthly budget and promotes self-reliance for future independent living skills.
- c. In the Orange County area there are approximately 3,000 foster youths in out-of-home care. In many cases this does not include youth who are living with extended family members. This sector is known as Kinship Care. Some of these youths do not receive benefits through the County and the caretakers lack the resources to provide many of the basic needs for the youth they care for. The Kinship Living Program was developed to assist in providing these resources.
