Project Details:

Cabrillo Elementary School is located in Point Loma, San Diego CA and has very little in community support due to, among other things, a transient population of military families who are subject to deployment at any time. One significant lack at this school is any type of arts program.

This project will help pay for students to attend the NTC Foundation's Arts Education Program for Underserved Youth. Instruction is held in the Liberty Station Arts District. The program uses different fields of art to help students learn in new and creative ways; to promote a positive learning attitude; to increase self-esteem; and to encourage exploration of new possibilities for the future. Because these students come from a variety of backgrounds, students attending this program will receive learning opportunities that are not otherwise available without outside support from community groups.

The students will take classes with professionals in the fields of photography, dance, art, music, playwriting, animation, writing, and more at no charge to the students or their school

The timeline for this project takes place during the 25/26 school year.

Project funds will be used help to pay for instructors' time, materials and bus transportation between Cabrillo Elementary School and Liberty Station.

Local community groups already involved in this project include Point Loma Assembly and Point Loma Optimists.

Point Loma Rotary Club members will periodically be able to observe various art classes while in session with the students.

Who are Liberty School students?

Liberty School programming brings grade 1 – grade 5 students, ranging from ages 6 – 11, from local Title 1 San Diego schools to Liberty Station, to experience the extraordinary Arts District Liberty Station. Students engage in a multi-week session of California Standards-based instruction embedding in the Arts. Youths take classes from in-resident teaching artists in the fields of dance, art, music, improv, martial arts, writing, quilting, and more, at no charge to students or their schools. Students work directly with professional artists to experience art-making that fosters creativity and imagination. The program uses the Arts to help students learn in new and creative ways; promote a positive attitude toward learning; increase self-esteem; interact and collaborate with others; and encourage exploration of new possibilities for the future.
