The Club Video and Radio Academy (CVRA) at the Boys & Girls Club of Brea has established a lab and studio setting that accommodates a multimedia development environment where both children and teens perform age appropriate grade level instruction with state of the art hardware/software with instructors and multi-media interns. The program is teaching video and audio production, photography, and graphic design while encouraging creative expression, and use of digital tools and professional software to create and edit footage, recordings and photos. The CVRA will result in the creation of both studio and "mobile" lab that can be used throughout the community. Club youth are able to use their equipment for a variety of community projects to showcase their Club's community outreach and community service projects in Brea, including a couple promotional videos for the Brea Rotary Club.
