Project Title: New Book Shelves and Seating for Villa Park Elementary

Progress Report Final Report

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
 The Villa Park Elementary School library had not been updated in many years and was in desperate need of improvement. The Villa Park Elementary "Home and School League" along with library staff identified the libraries most urgent needs. Using matching grant funds, The Rotary Club of Villa Park purchased new bookshelves and 4 vinyl floor rocking chairs for the students to sit in. On March 20, 2015, volunteer members of the Rotary Club of Villa Park and the Villa Park Elementary Dad's club assembled and installed the library shelving. The chairs did not require assembly or installation.

Villa Park Elementary school officials were able to research and negotiate a lower price for the shelving and rocking chairs, which resulted in a \$1762.00 surplus. The surplus funds were used to purchase other needed items for the library. These additional items consisted of 2 more rocking chairs, 5 HP Chrome books laptop computers and a "Tech Tub" to charge the computers. The total cost of these additional items exceeded the original grant amount by \$253.00. The additional funds will be taken from the Community Service Committee budget. These items have been ordered and are expected to be delivered in early June 2015.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? Kim,
 Eleven Rotarians participated

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
 Assembled and installed the new library shelving. The other items required no installation.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
 Villa Park Elementary School has been serving the community for about 130 years. It has a yearly school population of approximately 600 students from Villa Park, the City of Orange and from Anaheim Hills. The students range in age from 5 to 12 years old. Villa Park Elementary School students will benefit for many years to come from this project.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?
 The learning environment at the Villa Park Elementary School will be enhanced.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?
 The Villa Park Elementary Home and School League assisted in identifying the needs of the school library and advocated for the project. The Villa Park Elementary Dad's Club helped assemble and install the shelving.
