1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

The purpose of the grant project was to stock two emergency food and supply pantries at the Buena Clinton Youth and Family Center and the Magnolia Park Family Resource Center in Garden Grove, California. This project also included special food distribution/mobile pantry events at both Centers. The project benefited local families and individuals in need with food and hygiene supplies. The following related activities have been completed:

- On 3/31/16 supplies were purchased from Costco to stock emergency pantries at both the Buena Clinton and Magnolia Park Family resource Centers. Supplies included: toothpaste, spaghetti, canned corn, soup, and macaroni and cheese (see attached receipt).
- Four special food distribution/mobile pantry events were conducted at the Buena Clinton and Magnolia Park Family resource Centers as follows:
 - Second Harvest Food Drop #1, Magnolia Park Family Resource Center, 10/30/15
 - Second Harvest Food Drops #2, Buena Clinton Family Resource Center, 11/11/15
 - Second Harvest Food Drop #3, Magnolia Park Family Resource Center, 1/29/16
 - Second Harvest Food Drop #4, Buena Clinton Family Resource Center, 3/11/16

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

Nine Rotarians participated in the project: Joe Hammer, AG Anvari, Miguel Cueva, Bill Annon, Vicki Rogriguez, Maria Stipe, Danny Krebs, Steve Larson, Jesse Cho

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

AG Anvari served as the primary project coordinator. He met with staff at both the Buena Clinton and Magnolia Family Resource Center to identify needs, shop for supplies, and coordinate food distribution events. Joe Hammer, Miguel Cueva, Bill Annon, Vicki Rodriguez, Danny Krebs, Steve Larson, and Jesse Cho participated in food distribution and pantry stocking activities. Maria Stipe and Vicki Rodriguez assisted with grant administration and progress reporting.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

The Emergency Food Pantry is estimated to have served approximately 200 families to date.

The Special Food Drop/mobile pantry events are estimated to have served over 400 individuals and families to date.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Families who are food insecure were provided with food, hygiene, and personal care supplies allowing them to reduce stress and increase stability within their households.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

- Food was provided by Second Harvest Food Bank, Orange County
- Magnolia Family Resource Center Staff worked with GG Rotary to coordinate and support related activities
- Buena Clinton Family Resource Center Staff worked with GG Rotary to coordinate and support related activities

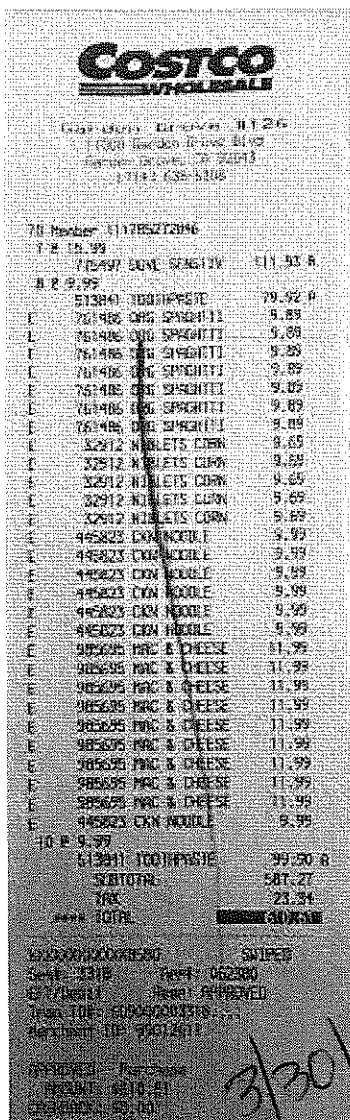

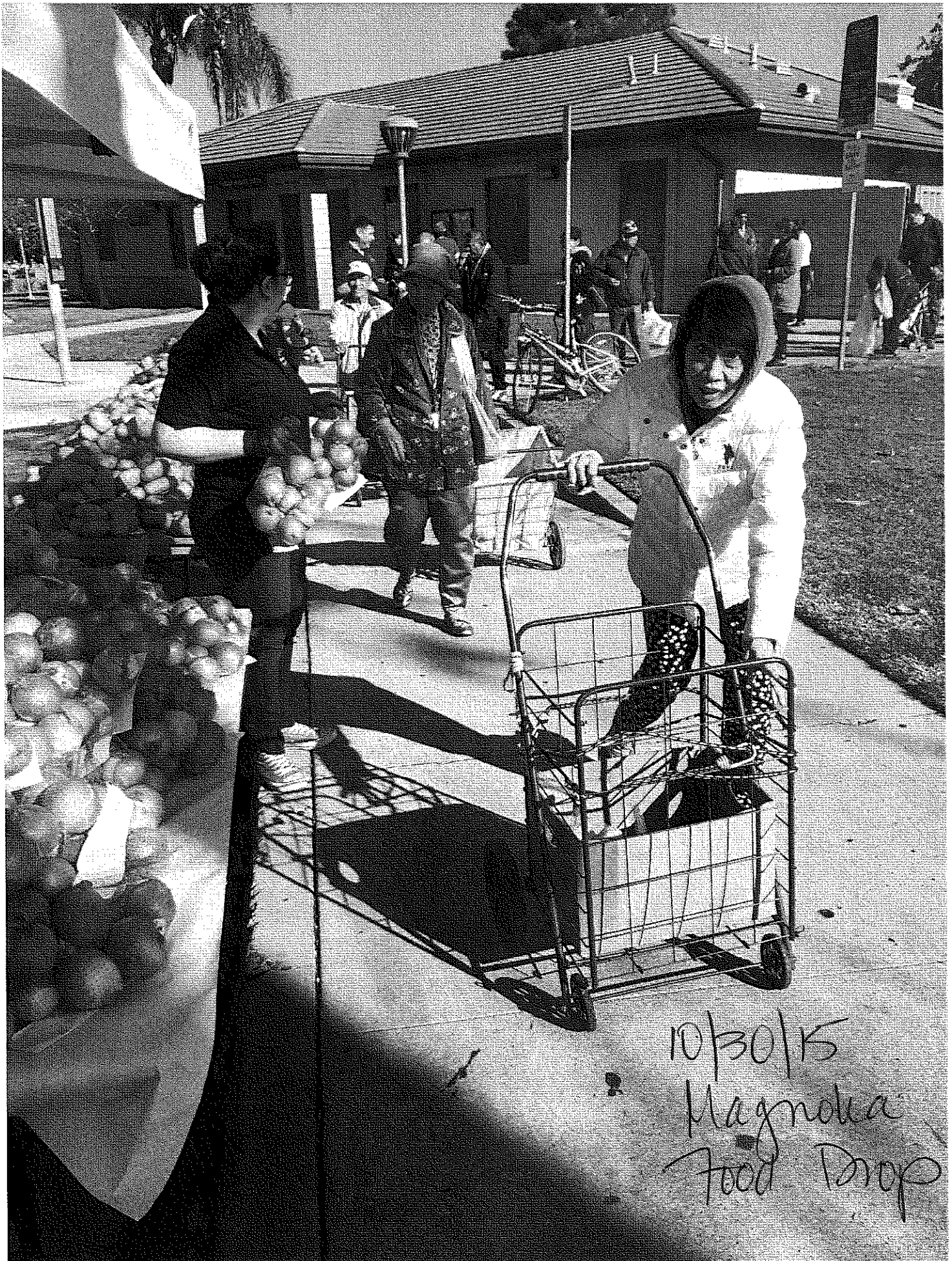

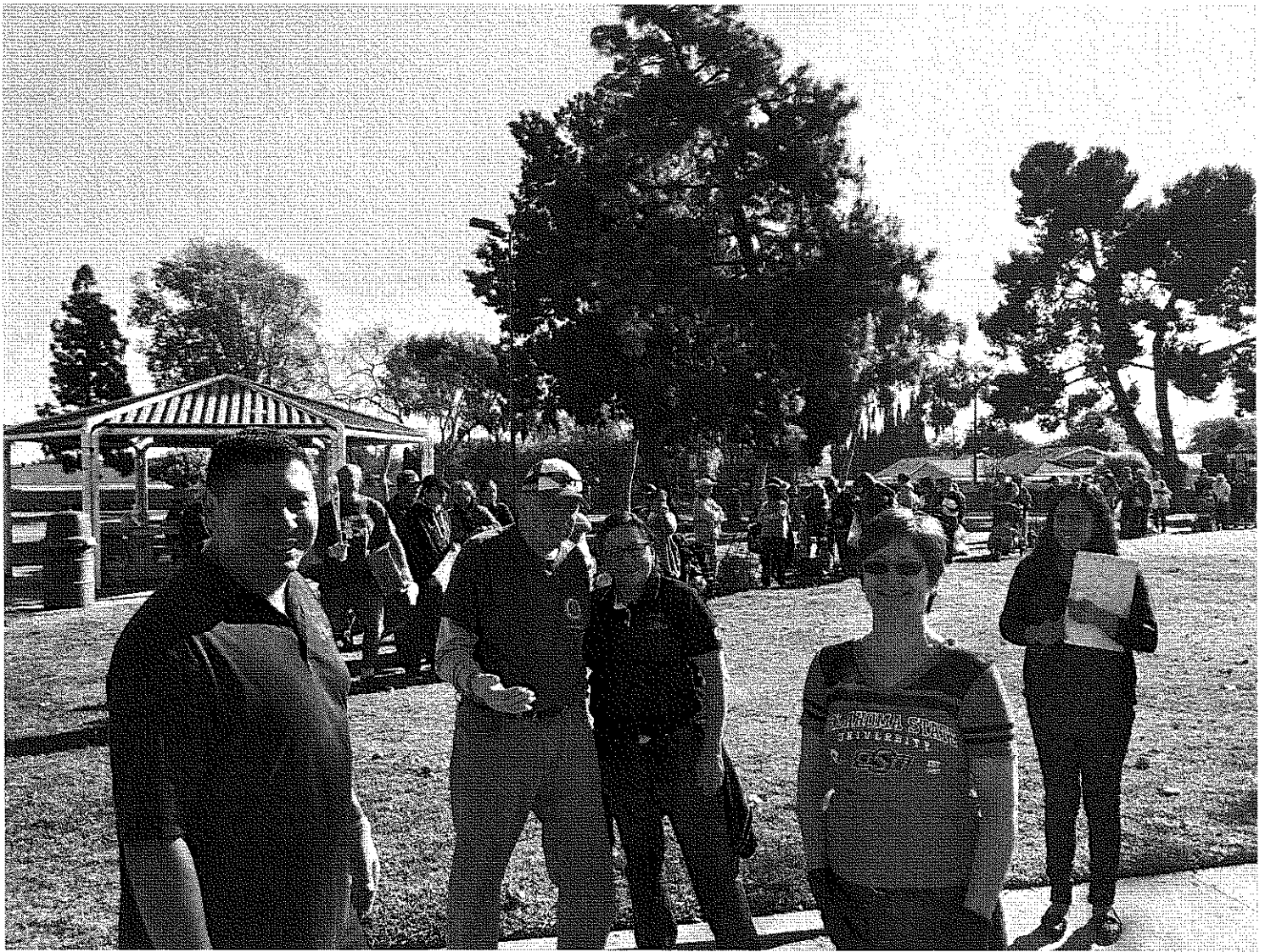
